Formal Legislative Procedure

The stages of the Parliamentary Process Timeline Formal procedure where the name and main aims of the bill are read out. There is then a First Reading vote on whether the House wants consider the bill any further. **Second Reading** Main debate on whole bill in which MPs debate the principles behind the bill. It focuses on the main principles and at the end a vote is taken. A detailed examination of each clause of the bill. This is usually done by a Standing **Committee Stage** Committee. Report Stage The committee report back to the House on any amendments. The amendments will then be debated, accepted or rejected. The final vote on the bill. Third Reading **House of Lords** If it was started in the House of Commons it is passed to the House of Lords where it goes through the same 5 stages. If the House of Lords make amendments it will go back to the House of Commons for them to consider the amendments. If it started in the House of Lords it will be passed to the House of Commons. The Monarch formally gives approval to the bill and it becomes law. Although this stage is not just **Royal Assent** a formality.
